OUR 5 TIPS

TAXI

TIP 1 TAKING A CAB

Unlike cabs on most Caribbean islands, the majority of taxis in Guadeloupe are metered. An additional 40 percent surcharge is added to fares between 9:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m everyday as well as on Sundays and holidays. If the car is not metered, travelers are advised to agree on a fare with driver prior to leaving. Note that credit cards are not always accepted thus make sure to always carry some change with you. Also, be aware that your cab driver may not be familiar with English so it is always recommended to write down the address on a piece of paper.

TIP 3 PLUGGING YOUR STUFF

We have the same voltage than in mainland France (220V) so make sure to bring a couple of adaptors.

TIP 4 HOW TO GET EUROS & BEST WAY TO PAY

Euro is the official currency in France. The currency exchange desk will be about to close at your arrival, so we recommend to arrive in Guadeloupe with some change in order to be able to pay for your taxi ride from the airport and any other small expenses you might have, such as a first taste at our delicious pastries in a "boulangerie"! For the rest of your journey you can withdraw money from the numerous ATM ("Distributeurs de billets" in French) located at the airport and everywhere else on the archipelago. Note that you will be asked to enter your pin number at the ATM at all times. In malls, restaurants and stores major credit cards are accepted.

TIP 5 BRUSH UP ON YOUR « FRANÇAIS »

Your basic French will take you a long way! However, do not worry if you don't speak French as Guadeloupeans are always happy to help even if it is with a broken English! They may feel shy and self-conscious at first to speak English as it is not their forte, but here is the best way to approach them; just tell them in French "Jene parle pas beaucoup le Francais" (meaning I do not speak a lot of French), by doing so, you are opening yourself to them and the communication will easily follow, trust us! Also the magic word in the Guadeloupe Islands is BONJOUR!! It will soon become a funny game to you. We say Bonjour all the time to everyone that crosses our path, crazy right? This is how we acknowledge each other. If you are asking for something and you have never met the person before, what do you say? BONJOUR!! Oui Ouil.

Driving This denotes a street. Do not enter. Blue and red sign indicate you are entering a "No Parking" or "No waiting It means that you are on a "route prioritaire" (priority route) and have priority over drivers on intersecting roads. Circular arrows in an isosceles triangle indicate that you are entering a roundabout; stay right; yield to all traffic in the circle. If the triangle has an "x" it means you are coming to a junction where traffic on the right has priority - give way to the right. This sign means you are coming to a junction of a minor crossroad. You have priority. The symbol identifies scenic overlooks and parking spaces.



ISLAND HOPPING

Do you know what makes a stay in the Guadeloupe Islands so unique? It is because there is not ONE Guadeloupe, but an entire archipelago of contrasts formed by FIVE ISLANDS. All are located within 20-45 min of each other, allowing for a premier island hopping experience. The largest islands, Basse-Terre and Grande-Terre are connected by a bridge and modern smooth roads reminiscent of highways in France. The outer islands Marie-Galante, Les Saintes and La desirade are connected by an efficient ferry service, the furthest being 45 minutes. You can Island Hop just for the day!



Round trip ferry tickets range from 25 to 45 euros. Every day ferry companies connect Grande Terre and Basse Terre to Marie-Galante, Les Saintes, La Desirade or Petite Terre Natural Reserve. Departures from the following ports: POINTE-A-PITRE, TROIS RIVIERES, or SAINT FRANCOIS (just book online or buy a ticket at the counter an hour before departure)

With 77% of its territories classified as a Natural Reserve, the Guadeloupe Islands are definitely an Eco-Tourism destination. Environmental interests have always been at the heart of concern of Guadeloupe's authorities, who set up the protection of the ecological heritage as a priority: protecting sea turtles for 35 years, installing national days dedicated to cleaning sea beds, the coastline and rivers. The Guadeloupe archipelago is also a proud UNESCO BIOSPHERE RESERVE since 1992. With over 110 miles of hiking trails spread all over the archipelago, the Guadeloupe Islands can easily be explored by foot. One of the most scenic hikes is La Soufriere, a gently active volcano, reaching 4800 ft! Start your climb at the famous hot spring "Les Bains Jaunes", and make your way through the rainforest by taking the trail "Le Pas du Roy". Once you have reached the bottom of the volcano, the path "Chemin des Dames" will take you all the way to the top. This hike will take you about 4h30, so if you are looking for a less athletic option, you can choose to take the trail "Maison de la Foret" and then follow the path "Saut d'Eau de Matouba", this trail should take you about 2h30 to go and return.

Culturaholic

Located in front of the harbor overlooking the Caribbean Sea, Pointe-à-Pitre is the beating heart of the Guadeloupe Islands. Soak up the lively atmosphere of the city nicknamed the New Orleans of the Caribbean. Admire the colonial buildings or shop for spices at Marché Saint-Antoine. Discover the history of the city by visiting St-Pierre and St-Paul Cathedral, the Saint John Perse Museum, the colorful district of La Darse and its traditional Creole houses. Step back in time and visit the Memorial ACTE Museum, part of UNESCO's Slave Route Project, a global initiative to promote the rapprochement of people



through the shared legacy of slavery. If you are up for it delve into GwoKa, our traditional Music and dance now part of the UNESCO List of the Intangible Cultural Heritage of Humanity since November 2014.
